Error Reduction, Sepsis Management, Infection Prevention, Patient Flow, Fall Prevention, Environmental Safety, and Hand Hygiene.




Measuring Quality



Cesarean Section Rate


Hazel Hawkins Memorial Hospital has a lower Cesarean Section Rate than the California average for First Deliveries by promoting vaginal birth through labor positioning, reducing inductions without medical reason, and physician standardized definitions for labor progress.






Skin to Skin at Delivery and Breastfeeding First Hour of Life

The Golden Hour is a critical time when a newborn is placed on the mom skin-to-skin and fed within the first hour of life. It is uninterrupted time. There are many benefits to skin-to-skin and early breastfeeding. For the baby, it can stabilize heartbeat and breathing, more successful long-term breastfeeding, and quicker body temperature adjustment after delivery. Mom benefits from an increase in hormones that helps lower her blood pressure and stress levels, decrease post-delivery bleeding and produce more milk for breastfeeding. Support for skin-to-skin and breastfeeding in the first hour of life has been proven to increase success with exclusive breastfeeding.



Exclusive Breastfeeding - Baby Friendly


Hazel Hawkins Memorial Hospital is moving forward with the requirements to be designated as a Baby Friendly Hospital. This process involves educating moms on breastfeeding, supporting their choices, making skin-to-skin at delivery the culture, even with cesarean sections, and encouraging breastfeeding within the golden hour. Measuring improvements in exclusive breastfeeding rate is one of the requirements to achieve Baby Friendly designation.

Arrival to Physician Visit


The number of minutes from patient arrival in Emergency Department to seeing a doctor is the number one concern for patients and is key for optimal patient outcomes. At Hazel Hawkins Memorial Hospital, we pride ourselves at having a much lower Door to Physician time than the average California hospital.

Arrival to Discharge


Because our physicians see the Emergency Department patients so quickly, the doctor can begin evaluating the patient, ordering diagnostic testing, and initiating treatments quickly. This translates to a shorter visit for the patients. At Hazel Hawkins Memorial Hospital. As you can see, we have a much lower Arrival to Discharge time than the average California hospital.

Arrival to Admission



Left Without Being Seen

Some patients decide to leave the Emergency Department before they are seen by the physician. Patients may leave for various reasons such as people who decide that their illness or injury is not serious enough for them to feel they need to wait to see the doctor. At Hazel Hawkins Memorial Hospital, we are proud that we have a much lower Left Without Being Seen time than the average California hospital.

Sepsis Mortality

Over 90% of sepsis infections start outside the hospital. Sepsis mortality is the percent of inpatients in the hospital who die from a severe infection. Lower percentage of death indicates better survival. At Hazel Hawkins Memorial Hospital, our focus on sepsis care has allowed us to have a much lower Sepsis Mortality rate than the average California hospital.
